



Future Continuous

The future continuous verb tense, sometimes called the future progressive, is the present participle form of a verb used with either *will* or *shall* and the verb *be*.

Future tense: I *think*.

Future continuous tense: I *will be thinking*.

The future continuous tense is used for showing that a continuing action will happen in the future.

Example 1:

They *will be traveling* in Europe this summer.

Example 2:

Those sirens *will be blaring* all night!

Verb Tenses:

Future Continuous
